EXPERIENCE A RICH BIODIVERSITY IN AZER BALJAN



Benefiting from a rich biodiversity, Azerbaijan is famous for its wide range of delicious food products, from fruits and vegetables to organically-made mountain honey. What is even more special about the country is the fact that travellers can observe how these products are produced first hand at familyrun farms and businesses, surrounded by breath-taking natural beauties.

To start with, travellers finding themselves in the subtropical southern corner of the country will encounter a must-try experience in Lankaran and Astara. This town is quite well-known for its tea plantations since 1912 when first tea bushes were planted here. It is highly recommended to visit 'Yashil Chay' (eng. 'Green Tea') in the village of Istisu. Along with tea plantations extending as far as the eye can see, here you can find a Tea Museum, guest house and restaurant serving delicious dishes from local cuisine.

Travelling to the north-western part of the country, it is easy to find multiple spots to enjoy agritourism experiences. One such destination is Sheki where a peaceful village of Oryet is home to a bio garden. Here, huge range of organic fruits, nuts and flowering plants are grown in picturesque orchards with views of the Caucasus Mountains. Guided tours of these orchards are the best way to learn about what local methods are used for cultivation methods and pick fruits to purchase. Of course, there is an onsite restaurant serving meals made from seasonal local ingredients.

About an hour drive from Sheki, you will find yourself in Gakh. This one is a perfect place to see ancient methods of beekeeping. Near the village of Lekit, there is a family business that keeps about 300 colonies of bees, producing various honey-based products. They also stage multiple workshops and a small openair museum for those keen on learning more about apiculture and find out about an endangered local wild beekeeping tradition.

Further to the north-west from Gakh, Zagatala Trout Fish Farm

has been operating since 1979. This farm now offers an eco tour, where professional fish breeders guide you through the entire process of trout breeding. After learning about the whole process, you can taste a great selection of fried and smoked trout at an onsite restaurant. With an early reservation, fishing and outdoor fish cooking are also available between May and September along with painting masterclasses.

Sheki-Zagatala route is also home to the unique Slow Food travel experience. This concept brings local producers and gastronomic communities in certain regions and multiple parts of the tourism value chain together while allowing travellers to enrich their experience through meetings with local farmers, cheesemakers, herders, winemakers, etc. to learn about different



types of food which have been produced since ancient times.

In addition to these examples of biodiversity in the regions, the capital city Baku has recently seen an opening of a unique bazaar after a major renovation. Sharg Bazaar (eng. Easter Bazaar) stands out as a magnificent manifestation of the Silk Road. Together with the separate bazaar sections selling fruit and vegetables, sweets, spices and dried fruits and souvenirs as well as a food court, there's also a traditional teahouse, contemporary cafes and a restaurant serving national dishes.

While you are here, you might as well visit Yashil Bazaar (eng.

Green Bazaar), located just up the road from Sharg Bazaar. This one is also full of the freshest produce from all around Azerbaijan. Fruits, dried fruits, vegetables, dairy products, meats, fish, herbs and tea are just some of the mouthwatering produce to taste and buy here. In particular, local specialties like pomegranates, honey, saffron, sturgeon and caviar are in abundance at this one too.

Having visited the above-mentioned corners and spots in Azerbaijan, you will not only be treated to delicious food varieties, but will also enjoy an interesting mix of cultural experiences and great hospitality too.





THREE BRAZIL DESTINATIONS FOR DIFFERENT TYPES OF TRAVEL Four alternative destinations worth exploring in Brazil

Florianópolis — for islandic nightlife

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Adventurous travelers looking to experience island vibes alongside Brazilian nightlife should consider Florianópolis — one of Brazil's most beautiful islands. Wherever heads turn, visitors will either find beautiful beaches, parties or afternoon/night clubs. The Jurere Internacional — Florianópolis' beach-side neighbourhood — promises the best of beachside Brazilian day parties.

But there's more. To the south of the island is Praia do Campeche and Armação. Here, boats leave for Ilha do Campeche, an island of archaeological interest (thanks to its several rock engravings and paintings) with Caribbean-like seas. Alternatively, keen surfers can head to Praia do Matadeiro, another Southern popular spot.

Fernando de Noronha — for crystal clear waters

Visitors wondering what paradise on earth looks like must visit Fernando de Noronha, a UNESCO World Heritage Site boasting beautiful beaches and unique ecotourism activities. The volcanic archipelago is perfect for families, couples, and friends who want to enjoy hiking, boat trips, snorkelling, surfing, as well as down time.

Located within the heart of Fernando de Noronha is Baía do Sancho — one of the most beautiful beaches in the world with crystal clear waters, teeming with marine wildlife. Those interested in seeing several types of fish, turtles, and small sharks can also head to Praia do Sueste or Praia do Porto. Based in Fernando de Noronha is Projeto Tamar, an organization that aims to protect and conserve a feeding and spawning area for rare sea turtle species. Tourists can embark on guided tours and lectures, learning from biologists about the life cycle of sea turtles and how to protect them. The island is a breeding area for green turtles and a feeding, growing, and resting area for juveniles of this species and the hawksbill turtle.

Minas Gerais — for historic, colonial architecture & art

The state of Minas Gerais is a great option for those who enjoy a combination of history, nature, and architecture.

The state has several countryside gems that are worth exploring at a slow pace. Ouro Preto, once the capital of Minas Gerais, is a colonial town in Serra do Espinhaço, known for its baroque architecture and for its steep, winding cobbled streets.

Elsewhere, admirers of architecture, nature, and culture can marvel at the baroque inspired, historic buildings, and secular churches of Diamantina. A city acting as a gateway to the waterfalls of Biribiri State Park.

A World Cultural Heritage Site, Congonhas is another city where visitors can explore the Bom Jesus de Matosinhos Sanctuary, an architectural, sculptural complex showcasing Christian art and expressive works. Congonhas is also home to one of Brazil's greatest artistic patrimonies – the works executed by António Francisco Lisboa, known as "Aleijadinho".

Estrada Real — for gastronomy & culture

Technically not a destination but worthy of a mention is the Estrada Real, Brazil's largest 1,600km long tourist route. Recognized for its historic significance, Estrada Real comprises of a series of tourist routes offering gastronomic, cultural, religious and adventurous experiences.

Travelers will be delighted to find paths full of cosy inns, urban and rural. Local residents are also friendly enough to offer camping facilities or home stay for those who need it.


Some of the main routes include the Old Way, the New Way, the Diamond Way and the Sabarabuçu Way. Visitors are awarded a Certificate of Completion should they collect passport stamps along the entire Estrada Real route. To obtain the certificate, visitors need to acquire a minimum number of stamps, which varies according to the path taken.

Emirates flies directly to Sao Paulo International Airport in Brazil every week. From there, connecting flights can take you to your next desired, diverse Brazilian haven.

Ways to Practice Mindfulness

AUSTRIA

Take a walk over fields and through forests, swim in crystal clear lakes, or see more stars than ever before under a brilliant night sky. Austria's landscapes offer gentle outdoor adventures which bring you back to your true self. Here are five ways to practice mindfulness in Austria's nature:

1. Sleep Under the Stars

A small, wooden house. One wall made of glass. A view of nothing but the lake and the stars. Spend a night in a bivouac on Lake Millstätter See in southern Austria and wake up completely refreshed.

Whether on the beach, in the luscious green of a forest glade, or high up above the pastures: a total of seven bivouacs make up this haven away from reality, a place for romantic togetherness. Made of larch and Swiss pine, the bivouacs are an authentic part of the landscape. Feel at one with nature, as you gaze through the large panorama windows at the stars sparkling in the night sky or the sun rising in the early morning. The approximate 15m2 (160 sq-ft) hideaway offers space for a bed, a table with chairs plus cuddly sheepskin rugs, as well as a small washroom.



Nearby hotels, a campsite, and a farm operate the little hideaways. In the mornings, you'll receive a breakfast basket, in the evenings a gourmet basket filled with local specialities. Simply enjoy the exquisite contents whilst sitting on the terrace with a view of the lake.

2. Hug a 500-Year-Old Tree

If you want to hug one of the biggest trees in the larch forest known as Zedlacher Paradise, you'll need at least four people. After all, these quiet giants have a diameter of up to seven metres. They had a long time to grow to their current size: The oldest specimens are 500 years old.

Here, an educational path meanders through the unspoilt wooded areas above Matrei in East Tirol. The larch trees radiate a pleasant calmness, and the air is heavy with the smell of moss and earth. At seven stations visitors become acquainted with the secrets of the region's sensitive ecosystem, and learn about its various inhabitants. The most beautiful time to experience this natural paradise is autumn, when the centuries-old larches have

turned golden yellow in colour. Walk Among Giants

3. Swim with the Snails

Austria's southernmost province Carinthia is famous for its numerous, deliciously warm lakes. A short way away from the hustle and bustle of the busy lake lidos, you'll find untouched nature at Lake Hafnersee, surrounded by rich and diverse scenery. To the west lies an expansive moor, to the south characteristic reeds serve as a natural sanctuary for water snails, clams and numerous insects.

4. Travel Back in Time

When visiting the Alpbachtal region in Tirol, you can travel not just in space, but also in time: A stroll through the open-air Museum of Tyrolean Farmhouses reveals how farmers lived in bygone days.

14 farms and 23 auxiliary buildings have been uprooted from various countryside locations around the province and reconstructed on the museum's grounds. Scenes from the farmers' lives are projected onto the walls of seven farmhouses so visitors get a vivid impression of what the daily lives of the inhabitants were really like. When you stand in the little rough-



hewn rooms of the old houses, you instinctively feel the hand of history as you lose yourself in time. Learn More About Country Living

5. Go to the Source, by Bike

Deep in the Karwendel mountains in Tirol, you'll witness a river being born.

The Isar river springs at an altitude of 1,162 metres, just a small mountain stream whose waters will merge into the mighty Danube and arrive in the Black Sea in just three days. But up here, everything is new and fresh. Take your bike to discover the area's numerous spots where the water springs from the ground and your daily routine might just start to seem miles and miles away. The best part? The cycle route from the village of Scharnitz to the river's origin winds its way through a completely car-free valley. Discover the Waters

GERMANY Culturally Rich, Naturally Beautiful

German National Tourism Board is preparing for an influx of GCC visitors looking to enjoy the upcoming long weekend. The recent announcement that visitors no longer require COVID-19 certificates to enter is expected to further encourage travel.

With Eid Al Adha just around the corner, GCC residents with a love for nature and looking for a perfect place to spend the holiday need look no further than Germany.

Six hours gate-to-gate and with multiple daily flight routes direct from the GCC to cities such as Frankfurt, Munich, Hamburg and Düsseldorf, Germany has long been favoured by the GCC traveller. KAILASH FESTIVALS



Aunique Kailash Valley, the remaining minority of approximately 3500 people living in three isolated but beautiful valleys known as Bumburet, Rambur, and Berir. The people of Kailash have a rich culture and are very strong footed about their identity. These people stand out from the remaining tribes, cultures, and communities due to their distinct traditions, religious practices, and festivals.

The people of Kailash celebrate many festivals during the year but notable festivals are three, the spring feast Chilam Joshi, in May, Uchal or Utchal, in August and Choimus, in winter. Chilam Joshi is one the most important festival, this four-day festival is celebrated across all three valleys of Bumburet, Rumbur, and Berir. Chilam Joshi begins with "Milk day" which, Kailash people store from household to offer their libation on the day of the festival. They ask for the blessing of God and pray for a prosperous year of agriculture, health, and safety of their herds. The main purpose of this festival is that Kailash men and women can find a spouse for themselves to get married. The women wear traditional attire with lively colors whereas, men wear traditional Shalwar Kameez with a waistcoat made of wool.

Uchal or Utchal

Uchal, also known as Utchal is a summer Kailash festival. During



The festival celebrated in annual harvesting with singing, dancing and paying homage to the nature for blessing them with good food and fruits. It is marked in the barley and wheat harvest season every year in August. Kailash people prepare cornbread, buttermilk, and cheese to celebrate the festival. They wear their traditional black robes, ornate cowries shelled headdresses and adorned with coloured necklaces and dance in a circle. During the festival, prayers and processions are held at a high plateau outside the village in Balangkuru, where the long night of dancing begins. The Uchal festival continues for several days and moving on to different locations within the valley.

Choimus is the winter festival, from 8-21 December, the most important celebration of the winter solstice and the return of the sun. Everyone wears new clothes, dance, feasts, and offer sacrifices. The first week of Choimus is for the Kailash people only. It is celebrated by feasting until the elders, who sit on a hilltop, watching the sun reaching the orbit, declare the beginning of the New Year. In the second week of Choimus, people show gratitude to their god with dance, music, and the sacrifice of goats. This part of a festival is public. It is dedicated to the god Balimain who is believed to visit from the mythical homeland of the Kailash, Tsyam, for the duration of the feast. Food sacrifices are offered at the clans' Jeshtak shrines, dedicated to the ancestors.






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Habtoor Grand Resort, Dubai Autograph Collection

Batumi Adjara GEORGIA

We were fortunate enough the meet and gain information about the region from Tinatin Zoidze, Head of Department of Tourism and Resorts of Ajara A. R.

Tinatin Zoidze got her education from Batumi Shota Rustaveli State University, Georgia, Business Administration, Faculty of Economics and Business, Ph.D. has a vast experience with Department of Tourism and Resorts of Ajara A. R.

She is the Director, Agency for the Development of Tourism Products since 2015 and heading the Tourism Department, Batumi Tourist Agency since 2011.

Tinatin Zoidze informed us the unique feature Georgia is the people who are immensely hospitable and around 65% of the repeat visitors are because of its diversity in terms of Nature, Culture and Traditions. The destination offers all four seasons with average summer temperature around 30c and in winter at 12c to 15c.

Tinatin Zoidze told us that the exceptional hospitality and the goodwill of the Georgian people make every trip to Georgia very special. A traditional Georgian feast is a superb display of the diversity of Georgian cuisine, cooking techniques, tablesetting traditions and other accompanying rituals. Adjarian cuisine is an inseparable aspect of Georgian cuisine. In mountainous Adjara, dairy products are common ingredients in many dishes.

Furthermore she informed us that Batumi is an attractive destination not only during the summer season but also in spring and autumn. Visitors can sunbathe or swim as early as the beginning of May. The sea becomes even more pleasant during September and October, given Batumi's long Indian summers. Winters are warm and summers are hot in Batumi. In addition to the seaside, visitors can also trek to the amazing mountainous regions of Adjara. Just a few hours away from the seaside.



Tinatin told us that Batumi is one of the oldest cities in Georgia founded as before the Common Era. The initial settlement "Batus" is mentioned in sources from the 4th century BCE. The city's unique history has contributed to the city's vast architectural diversity. In the 19th century, during the "Porto Franco" period, European architects completed a number of interesting architectural projects.
